To Apply:

The Cognitive Neuroscience of Communication-CT (CNC-CT) program is a T32 Institutional National Research Service Award funded by the NIDCD (Emily Myers and Inge-Marie Eigsti, Program Directors).

Postdoctoral scholars receive two years of funding. Fellows work with a faculty mentor to conduct research that bridges basic and clinical sciences. Candidates with training in cognitive neuroscience and communication disorders are invited to apply.
